# MLB delays opening day at least 2 weeks because of virus

New York — Major League Baseball delayed the start of its season by at least two weeks because of the coronavirus outbreak and suspended the rest of its spring training schedule.

Opening day had been scheduled for March 26. The decision announced Commissioner Rob Manfred on Thursday, left open whether each team would still play 162 games.

"It's unfortunate, but I think it's the proper measure we need to take now given the situation the country's in and the world's in," New York Yankees star Giancarlo Stanton said. "It's important to know that some things are bigger than baseball, bigger than sports at the moment. Once we're able to hopefully get a hold on some things and get some questions answered we can figure out when things can continue."

announcement The came while some spring training games in Florida were still in progress. MLB followed the NBA, NHL, MLS and college basketball tournaments in altering schedules because of the pandemic.

The minor league baseball season, which was to

start April 9, also will be delayed along with qualifying in Arizona for this year's Olympic baseball tournament and for next year's World Baseball Classic.

"We're ultimately all people. We all love the game of baseball, but this is a far bigger issue for all of us right now, and we're trying to work our way through it together," Seattle Mariners owner John Stanton said at the team's camp in Peoria, Ariz.

"I believe that this is going to be something that will have a lot more twists and turns to it. I don't have a high degree of confidence that we will start on April 9," he said.

MLB had continued to play into Thursday, two weeks before the season had been set to start with a pair of simultaneous games: Detroit at Cleveland and World Series champion Washington at the New York Mets.

Texas had been looking forward to the opening of its retractable-roof ball-park, Globe Life Field, first with an exhibition against St. Louis on March 23 and then a formal opener against Mike Trout and the Los Angeles Angels on March 31.

MLB had not had a mass postponement of openers since 1995, when the season was shortened from 162 games to 144 following a 7 1/2-month players' strike that also wiped out the 1994 World Series. Opening day was pushed back from April

11.1% because the games were lost due to a strike.

After a 32-day spring training lockout in 1990 caused opening day to be delayed a week until April 9, the season was extended by three days to allow each team a full 162-game schedule.

Baseball's first strike lasted from April 1-13 in 1972, and the season started April 15. Teams played 153-156 games.

This year marked the earliest opening day other than for international games. As it stood, Game 7 of the World Series would've been Oct. 28.

If regular-season games are lost this year, MLB could attempt to reduce salaries by citing paragraph ll of the Uniform Player's Contract, which covers national emergencies. The announcement Thursday said the decision was made "due to the national emergency created by the coronavirus pandemic."

Spring training games were suspended as of 4 p.m. EDT Thursday, and games in progress were allowed to finish. Minnesota notified fans by leaving copies of MLB's press release on benches at Hammond Stadium in Fort Myers, Fla., where a 6:05 p.m. game against Baltimore had been scheduled.

## IndyCar, NASCAR closed to fans amid COVID-19 pandemic

St. Petersburg, Fla. — IndyCar and NASCAR will race this weekend without spectators, while Formula One's Australian Grand Prix was called off entirely, as auto racing joined other sports in being affected by concerns over the COVID-19 pandemic.

IndyCar pushed for-ard with Sunday's Sunday's season-opening race after the mayor of St. Petersburg said Thursday fans would not be permitted to attend. Only essential personnel can enter the fenced area surrounding the temporary street course through downtown St. Petersburg.

Competitors will have to answer a questionnaire for health screening before entry. Practice

sessions, the driver autograph session and other events today were canceled. IndyCar typically draws about 130,000 to a three-day street festival capped by Sunday's race.

NASCAR said it will run its next two races without fans, starting this weekend in Atlanta and continuing at Homestead-Miami Speedway. Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos A. Giménez said the county was under a state of emergency and NASCAR racing would be postponed unless officials chose to run the race without fans.

## NHL commissioner: Season will 'pause' because of coronavirus

The NHL has placed its season on ice — for now. Commission-NHL er Gary Bettman said Thursday the league will "pause" its season, effective immediately, be-

cause of the coronavirus pandemic. The move came one day after the NBA suspended its season after a player tested positive for COVID-19. Bettman said the hope

is to resume play later and still award the Stanley Cup.

"Following last night's news that an NBA player has tested positive for coronavirus — and given that our leagues share so many facilities and locker rooms and it now seems likely that some member of the NHL community would test positive at some point — it is no longer appropriate to try to continue to play games at this time," Bettman said.

The NHL Players' Association backed the decision, calling it "an appropriate course of action at this time" and adding: "The players are looking forward to the opportunity to resume play in front of hockey fans everywhere."

The NHL is halting play with 189 games left in the season and

uncertainty about how many more — if any could be played before the playoffs, which typically begin in early April. A handful of European hockey leagues have already called off the remainder of their seasons.

"We will continue to monitor all the appropriate medical advice, and we will encourage our players and other members of the NHL community to take all reasonable precautions — including by self-quarantine, where appropriate," Bettman said. "Our goal is to resume play as soon as it is appropriate and prudent, so that we will be able to complete the season and award the Stanley Cup."

The NHL preceded its decision by having all 31 teams cancel practices and pregame skates.

It was difficult to determine what steps teams or players can take in regards to practicing or even working out during the hiatus. For now, Martin Frk scoring with 4:41 remaining in the Los Angeles Kings' 3-2 win over Ottawa stands as the final goal of the 2019-20

support the NHL and NHLPA's decision to suspend the season for the safety of the teams and their fans. We look forward to the day we can get back playing the game we love in front of full arenas."

Following St. Louis' 4-2 win at Anaheim, Blues coach Craig Berube was already wondering how to prepare for the unscheduled and indefinite time off.

"You can practice as much as you want, but without playing games it is difficult," said Berube, who played 17 seasons in the NHL. "It's a bigger issue than a hockey game. We have to deal with what we have to. We have to keep ourselves in shape and as sharp as we can if we start up again."

Former Sabres captain Brian Gionta was supposed to be among the players honored tonight as part of Buffalo's 50th anniversary celebrations.

"I think that's the least of the worries," Gionta said. "I think everybody is worvid said. "As players, we ried about their families,

their loved ones, and the bigger picture in general, and all that other stuff is secondary noise. It's something we haven't seen in our lifetime, and it's much bigger than sports."

The Stanley Cup has been awarded every year since 1893 with two exceptions: 1919, when the final was canceled after five games because of the Spanish flu outbreak, and 2005, when the season was called off because of

a lockout. "It's become apparent that the situation is much larger than sports," Boston center Patrice Bergeron said. "In a time like, this it is important we continue to listen to experts whose job it is to maintain the safety and well-being of the population until the issue stabilizes.'

The NHL has not said any player has tested positive for COVID-19. The Washington Capitals, who used the same visiting locker room as the Utah Jazz at Madison Square Garden in New York after them, said they "will continue to close-

hockey operations staff." The Tampa Bay Lightning, who followed the Jazz into two arenas last weekend and occupied the same locker room while in Boston, said deep cleaning and sanitizing was done before they arrived.

'We also understand that with no actual contact with an infected person, our risk levels are low," the Lightning said in a statement. "As we are at no more risk than the general population and nobody in hockey operations has any symptoms, we are not subject to being tested at this time."

Dallas Stars forward Alexander Radulov has been sick, but team President Brad Alberts said players had not yet been tested. A message left for Radulov's agent was not immediately returned.

"If anybody in (the) organization gets (the) virus, obviously we'll have to test," Alberts said. "(There's) no testing in place and I think we've got a healthy group as of monitor the health right now."

Alberts added the Stars would not be practicing during the league's hiatus. Asked what the best-case scenario is, Alberts said: "I think what everyone is hoping for is that we take a short pause over the next several weeks and in a month or so, we can kind of get the season back reenergized."

# MLS shutting down for 30 days because of outbreak

FORT LAUDERDALE, FLA. Major League Soccer is shutting down for 30 days because of the coronavirus, delaying the home opener for the expansion team co-owned by former England captain David Beckham.

"Our clubs were united today in the decision to temporarily suspend our season — based on the advice and guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Public Health Agency of Canada and other public health authorities," MLS Commissioner Don Garber said in a statement Thursday.

Inter Miami, co-owned by Beckham and Jorge Mas, had been scheduled to play its home opener Saturday. MLS started its season on Feb. 29, and each of the 26 teams has played two league matches.

In addition, the U.S. Soccer Federation canceled exhibitions March and April for its men's and women's national teams as precaution.

The men had been scheduled to play the Netherlands in Eindhoven on March 26 and Wales four days later in Cardiff, preparation for the scheduled start of World Cup qualifying in September. The women

had been slated to face Australia at Sandy, Utah, on April 10 and Brazil four days later at San Jose, Calif.

The Confederation of North, Central American and Caribbean Association Football suspended its Champions League because competition of the pandemic. CON-CACAF had not yet announced a decision regarding its other events, which include men's Olympic qualifying in Guadalajara, Mexico.

As a result, the match between Cruz Azul and Los Angeles FC set for Thursday night was postponed. The competition is currently in the first leg of the quarterfinals.

The Mexican national team also canceled matches in Charlotte, N.C., on March 26 against the Czech Republic and in Arlington, Texas, on March 29 against Greece, citing travel restrictions. Greece's March 26 match against Costa Rica at Harrison, N.J., also was called

The National Women's Soccer League canceled preseason matches ahead of its April 18 openers.

"We are reviewing all contingency plans related to our regularseason schedule and are monitoring developing events and their potential impact," NWSL Commissioner Lisa Baird said. "We are deeply

The vast majority of people recover from the new virus. According to the World Health Organization, people with mild illness recover in about two weeks, while those with more severe illness may take three to six weeks to recover.

Inter Miami's stadium is located in Broward County, where seven CO-VID-19 cases had been confirmed as of Thursday morning. Cases have also been confirmed in Palm Beach County, on Broward's north border, and Miami-Dade County on Broward's south border.

"We were 48 hours from kickoff with a tremendous amount of excitement in our community and having a full house here on Saturday," Mas said. "That does not change. It'll just be a different date."

Inter Miami sporting director Paul Mc-Donough said calls would be held later Thursday to determine exactly how the team will spend the time off. Saturday would have been the first time an MLS match was played in South Florida since 2001, and Beckham's group has been working toward getting a team back in the area for about six years.

Mas said this is just another challenge along that road.

"We'll deal with it the best way," Mas said.

For months, the lives of these players revolved around gearing up for this 2020 postseason. Now they're no doubt left with a sense of emptiness, because the bizarre circumstances of these times meant they didn't even get a chance to go validate their incredible regular season with some postseason glory.

For Azubuike, a senior, and Dotson, a likely early

NBA draft entrant, this must be unfathomable. They were poised to write their own memorable chapters in KU's storied program — maybe even leave as legends, like Danny Manning or Mario Chalmers. Now they and their teammates become an all-time whatif in KU lore. Unfortunately for

clarified to the Journal-World that the suspension of "athletics events" would include practices. Kansas football's spring practice was scheduled to begin March 17 and run through April 18.

The Big 12 Conference also announced Thursday that it had suspended all other conference championships until April 15 and that, beginning today, it had suspended all regular-season competitions, on- and off-campus recruiting and out-of-season practices until March

"The suspension of athletic-related

activities does not include campus-based practices for in-season sports, strength and conditioning activities for all sports and does not apply to teams and individuals participating in NCAA Championship competition," the Big 12 statement read.

In addition to calling off the men's and women's basketball championships, the upcoming gymnastics and equestrian championships have been canceled. Future Big 12 champi-

onships this season will be evaluated by April 15, the conference said.

The last likely major college basketball game of any import to be played, a Big East Tournament contest between St. John's and Creighton at Madison Square Garden, was abandoned at halftime Thursday.
